by the barn on a Thursday night during the Mounted Eagles' therapeutic horsemanship lessons you'll more than likely find Bucky Philips there. Bucky is a resident of the Towering Pines Group Home in Brainerd and has been riding with the Mounted Eagles for about 7 years. Although small in stature, Bucky makes a big impression when you meet him. He is very outgoing and never meets a stranger. He always greets you with a smile and an extended hand. Bucky has a mild developmental delay but he's never at a loss for words - intelligent words. The volunteers generally request to work with Bucky during the riding lesson because he is so much fun. You'll hear conversations between the sidewalker and Bucky on topics ranging from baseball games to the importance of attending church and worshipping God. His kind heart and concern for others makes him a "giant" in our world. When he's riding independently and there's no human at his side, he talks to his favorite friend at the barn, his horse, Jazzmin. One might hear him conversing about the weather or asking her how good he is riding that particular evening. He mostly tells her what a great job she is doing in helping him. Jazzmin listens and nods her head in agreement most of the time. She never talks back to him, so he just keeps on smiling and bending her ear.

Bucky has overcome his fear of heights and has progressed from being afraid to mount his horse to riding independently at a walk and a trot. He handles his horse with gentle hands and a confident spirit. He competes in the timed events at the annual horse show and usually comes out with several blue ribbons. Bucky spends time grooming his horse and helps with taking the saddle and tack off at the end of his lesson. He enjoys this time with Jazzmin and sometimes helps "put her to bed" since he's the last one to ride her for that day. Bucky sets a great example for his fellow residents as well as his friends. He has

encouraged several of them to come and ride horses with him. Coming to ride horses is the highlight of his week! Congratulations, Bucky, on your many achievements in the arena and in your every day life! We're very proud of you!

We are extremely excited about beginning the 2006-riding season at Mounted Eagles. There are so many new things happening. We have been working really hard to improve our current programs and to develop new ones that will ensure the time spent at the barn will be even more rewarding and beneficial to the riders and their families. You'll see many changes this year, but a change you won't see is in our mission and vision. We will always give our best to make a real difference in your lives.

The biggest change that you will see is that we will be in a new location. Yes, it is true; we will no longer be operating at the Clare B Training Center. We have had 12 good years there but Toni has decided to move to a new location and we have decided to go with her. Toni and partners have purchased a facility on Hwy 25 just South of where County Rd 22 enters Hwy 25. It is 7.8 miles straight South of the intersection of County Rd 18 & 25. We don't have the exact address or what the facility will be named at this time so we will send you that information as soon as we have the specifics. It is a beautiful place and I'm sure you all will be very happy when you see the facility. Because of this move we will not be able to start our season until April. We had hoped for March but that will not be possible with everything at the barn being moved during that time. The new facility has a heated arena so we will be able to extend our riding season and eliminate the 5-month lapse that we have had in the past because of weather issues as well as canceling on days that it has been too cold.
