Well, it's been a busy four months of 2009 for the Mounted Eagles. Seems like it has been just a few weeks since the beginning of the New Year and now it's the end of April already! January - We settled in to our new home at Spirit Horse Center and started our year off with 56 riders and 51 very active volunteers

Wendy Nyberg is a lovely woman who is challenged by mild mental retardation and mental illness. She is number 6 of 8 children and grew up in Mizpah, MN. She graduated from high school in Chisholm, MN. in 1978. Wendy is friendly and outgoing and loves to talk and never forgets a thing! She struts in with her cowboy boots and asks everyone how they are and tells us she has missed us. Each week she asks one of her instructors if she has seen her sister and upon finding she has not wants to know why. Mounting always starts with this discussion. Wendy begins the lesson by asking what horse she is riding and visiting with her volunteers. One of her sisters has always had horses and she would never ride because she was so intimidated by their size. Wendy loves animals and started coming to Mounted Eagles and was stiff and uncomfortable but kept coming and has continued for five years now. She rides weekly and has ridden in several annual Mounted Eagles horse shows and proudly displays her ribbons to friends and family as well as her annual trophies for improved horsemanship. Wendy is dependant on her team of a sidewalker and leader to know what she needs to do next but as they back off from her horse, she is realizing she is able to steer her horse by herself and we are seeing her confidence level rise and her skills increase. When her lesson is finished and she returns to the mounting block to dismount she always rubs her horses neck and tells him he is a nice boy.



When she is not riding, she lives in Baxter and earns an income by cleaning rooms at the Casino and doing piece work for PA. Wendy loves her family and keeps in touch with her nieces and nephews by cards and letters. She loves to shop and travel. She also loves to do beading and collects anything to do with rabbits. She will be turning the "Big 50" this year and a big family party for her is being planned. Wendy is enjoyed by all of her friends at Mounted Eagles and we all wish her the happiest of birthdays and a very bright future.

We have a commitment to never turn anyone away who is qualified to participate in our program because of their inability to pay, therefore we offer full or partial scholarships for riders who face financial hardships but would benefit greatly from our services. Fees are \$20 per ½ hour session but the operating cost is \$43.29 per ½ hr per rider per horse. God continues to bless us and we are counting on continued financial support of our friends, families, individual supporters, businesses and grantors to help us make it thru these difficult times.
