Mounted Eagles has joined Special Olympics of Minnesota! Special Olympics Minnesota believes that through sports training and competition, people with intellectual disabilities benefit physically, mentally and socially; families are strengthened; and the community at large, both through participation and observation, is united in understanding people with intellectual disabilities in an environment of equality, respect and acceptance.

Earlier this year, nine Mounted Eagles volunteers were trained under Special Olympics guidelines to become equestrian coaches. Currently there are two athletes who will compete at the state competition on August 20 in North Branch, Minnesota. Alicia Paine of Brainerd is 31 years old and has been riding with Mounted Eagles for 13 years. Justin Fairbanks of Nisswa is 20 years old and has been riding with Mounted Eagles for 11 years. Justin and Alicia are both very

excited to be taking their riding experience to the competition. They have been hard at work training specifically for the competition since June 1. Alicia and Justin have been training with horses owned by Mounted Eagles, however, at the competition, they will use horses provided specifically for the competition. This will be a challenge for the riders, as it will not only be an unfamiliar




## Rider of the Third Quarter - Mitchell Ruis

Mitchell Ruis is a wonderfully cheerful 19 year old who is filled with much love and affection. He has been challenged with uncontrollable seizures that affect him neurologically, causing developmental delays and moderate mental retardation. While Mitchell's vocabulary is limited, he is very resourceful about making his wishes known. Be sure to hide your ink pens, he is very fond of them and yours may just disappear when Mitchell is around!

When Mitchell arrives for his riding lesson, he seems to almost dance into the riding arena with his long legs and arms. He loves horses and when you ask him if he wants to begin his lesson by leading his horse, or by riding, he will quickly make his wishes known - "ride". Mitchell mounts his horse Wind Dancer and along with his coach they begin the riding lesson. Mitchell is grinning from ear to ear as looks over his shoulder at the family member who brought him. With great excitement he keeps pointing down at his horse. Now it is time to get to get down to business. Mitchell, hold your reins this way and look at me. Turn your horse this way and ride to the big doors. Now steer your horse and weave the cones. Wind Dancer patiently carries his special rider as Mitchell, holding his reins, leans way off to the side in the direction that he wants his horse to turn. First this way and then that way. His big smile lifts you and you can see that he is trying so hard for you. Some lessons go very smoothly and Mitchell is able to follow every direction. Some lessons are a bit more difficult and it proves hard for Mitchell to complete what is requested of him. But no matter how the lesson is going, he is happy to be on Wind Dancer and they are riding partners for this special time together.

When Mitchell isn't at the barn, he loves spending time with his close knit family. He especially adores his Grandpa Ruis. Mitchell thinks "Thomas the Train" is the greatest! Mitchell has amazing eyesight and can spot a train track, or a train, even when it is far away from the road. He enjoys every minute of road trips, even the very long ones. Mitchell especially enjoys being outside where he can ride his three-wheeled bike on his family's trails. At the end of



each week you will find him listening to the singing at church and then he is off to greet his special friends during fellowship time.


