With a background in communications and nonprofit management, I look forward to helping the organization grow so other people can experience the joy and pride our son has found in horseback riding. Much of my time is spent working in St. Paul for Hillrom Respiratory Health, a medical device company specializing in respiratory products, as a Training and Development Manager. I wish every parent has the opportunity to share in the joy and excitement when their child or adult runs in the house to waving a ribbon they earned from Susie.
