Justin Fairbanks has been riding with Mounted Eagles Therapeutic Horseback Riding Program for 8 years and never ceases to touch our hearts every time he comes into the room. He has a wonderful loving presence with shining eyes and an innocence that makes you want to hug him. Justin has Prader-Willi Syndrome. It is genetic and the most common characteristic of all challenged with this is issues of food. Their stomachs don't tell their brain when it is full. So therefore, they are always searching out food. When his ride is complete, his first words are "Good job? - 2 pieces?" (as in candy). They have varying levels of cognitive abilities and delays and are mostly short in stature with a low metabolism. This does not, however, stop Justin or his family from being very active and caring people.

The first thing Justin does when he gets off the bus on Thursday, even before he looks for his snack, is to go for the phone and check to see if Aggie's voice is on the answering machine at the barn saying, "See you at the barn." This lets him know that there will be riding tonight. If he does not hear this he is visibly saddened. Justin enjoys his friends at the barn and talks to them all the way out the door and up the stairs of the mounting block. We have to keep reminding him about the task at hand, which is to walk to the horse and mount. He rides Earl, who is a Belgium Horse with a nice

broad back and wonderful gait for Justin to sit - they are buds. We warm up and work on the day's lesson . . . yes we have to remind him to stay focused and remind him to watch where he is going, but Justin is learning the task at hand and really enjoys riding his horse and being able to independently accomplish what is asked of him. He has earned many ribbons at our annual participant horse show and trophies for improved horsemanship at our Annual Riders' Banquet.

Justin is a much loved young man with wonderful support from family and friends. He is also very involved in 4-H with his sister and mom. (Of course, dad gets roped in too.) He participates in the bicycle, cat, flower, gardening, poultry, food and nutrition projects. He likes all kinds of music, his riding at the barn, and he loves church where he hands out bulletins, helps light the candles and assists wherever else he is able.
